A \$3,000 check was presented recently to the Arc Northern Chesapeake Region from the Enterprise Holdings Foundation in support of the seventh annual “Kicks for Chase” charity soccer game between the University of Maryland Baltimore County Retrievers and La Salle University Explorers.

UMBC won by a final score of 4-0 at the game in April; funds raised support the Arc NCR's services for people with differing abilities (intellectual and developmental disabilities).

Kicks for Chase began in 2013 in memory of Chase Bugarin. Chase, son of UMBC soccer standout Bryan Bugarin and his wife, Amy, was born with Down syndrome and severe complications. In his memory, and to benefit kids like Chase with Down syndrome, UMBC men's soccer began "Kicks for Chase" to raise money for children with differing abilities.
