






Mondays and Thursdays are for Zumba

Throughout this annual report, you will see milestones that have occurred in our agency. Many of them are signature changes that have helped move forward people with disabilities being integrated into all aspects of the community. With these changes, people started to see that supported individuals deserve the same opportunities as everyone else and that allowing a path for a more independent life was the best option. Moving forward, it is the job of The Arc NCR to ensure all people, with or without disabilities live in an inclusive and interdependent world, meaning we all support one another.

Looking forward, we continue to progress onward with additional opportunities in employment, how people live, and how we engage in activities in the community. The Arc NCR is looking for people to have similar experiences as most other typical adults, such as increasing vocational knowledge similar to a college experience.

This year, The Arc NCR is particularly proud of being able to place 43 people into new employment positions in Harford County. Those individuals all completed the Customized Employment and Discovery Program, which was in its second year at The Arc NCR. These opportunities were jobs of choice by the supported individuals and they received soft and hard skills training to prepare for the position. The Arc NCR continues to focus heavily on employment and training and will develop additional, innovative opportunities in the coming years.

We could not have provided over 945 supports to over 443 people in 2018 without the support of our community. It is our great county, and strong business partnerships that have allowed for collaboration to happen and our programs to be more successful. On behalf of The Arc Northern Chesapeake Region, we thank you for all your support. We are deeply grateful and appreciative and look forward to growing our partnerships in the coming years.
