The DDA provides a coordinated service delivery system, so that people receive appropriate services oriented toward the goal of full integration into their community. The DDA's community-based service delivery system includes various home and community-based services and supports provided through either a Medicaid State Plan, Waiver program or via DDA State funded services. The DDA currently is unable to meet all the requests, so it established a waiting list. The waiting list is prioritized so that people with the greatest need are helped first. The Charting the LifeCourse framework was developed by families to help individuals with disabilities and families at any age or stage of life develop a vision for a good life, think about what they need to know and do, identify how to find or develop supports, and discover what it takes to live the lives they want to live.

Maryland Higher Education Commission Community College Tuition Waiver for Students with Disabilities Receiving SSI or SSDI

Exempts individuals receiving SSI or SSDI from paying tuition at community colleges in Maryland for up to 12 credits per semester if taking classes as part of a degree or a certificate program designed to lead to employment. The waiver is limited to 6 credits if enrolled in community college credit courses for any other reason. A course must have at least 10 enrolled students for the waiver to apply.
